

Gradute Law Apprenticeship Overview

This 30-month programme is intended for candidates who hold a bachelor's degree in law or an LLB.

In this apprenticeship you will gain academic and occupational practise whilst preparing for Parts 1 and 2 of the Solicitors Qualifying Exams. Apprentices who successfully complete the programme and pass the SRA Character & Suitability test will become qualified solicitors and can start practising law on the first day.

This apprenticeship is the perfect opportunity for you to work whilst you learn and acquire advanced academic credentials to become a qualified solicitor.

To pursue this graduate apprenticeship, candidates must have an employer sponsor them.

"This route is designed to prepare candidates for Parts 1 and 2 of the new Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE)"



How is it funded?

This qualification is 95% government-funded.

This funding is available to all law firms in England and as a registered provider Datalaw can take advantage of this funding on your firm's behalf to subsidise the cost of this qualification.

SQE 1 & 2 exam costs (£4,564) and SQE preparation costs (over £7,200) are covered via 95% Government Funding.



What is Included?

- Following completion, subject to the SRA Character & Suitability test, become a licensed solicitor.
- Prepares students for Parts 1 and 2 of the Solicitors Qualifying Exams
- 1-2-1 Coaching
- Online Classroom Sessions

Cost

£1012.50 + VAT

The full cost of this qualification is £20,250. If co-funded your firm will pay a 5% contribution, which is £1012.50+VAT, and the ESFA will fund the rest. This is more cost effective than the LPC or PSC, which if purchased separately would usually cost between £12,000 - £16,000 +VAT each.



Entrance Requirements

2.1 or above on a UK law bachelor's degree or an LLB.

You must also be employed by a UK law firm.

Duration

The duration of this qualification will depend on the optional legal modules you choose, the number of hours you work per week, and your prior legal learning/experience. However, on average this apprenticeship takes 30 months to complete.

End Point Assessments

Throughout this apprenticeship, you will be building a portfolio of occupational and academic evidence of work. Nearing the end of this apprenticeship you will participate in a gateway meeting with your employer and coach to confirm you have met the required level to complete the apprenticeship. Once ready, you will be entered for your end-point assessment and final grading. The end-point assessment is a two-part assessment. Part 1 consists of two written assessments and Part 2 consists of a competency-based interview, where you will be asked questions regarding your portfolio of work.

Career Progression

As a recognised graduate course this route is designed to help candidates become a licensed solicitor. This apprenticeship prepares students for day 1 as a qualified solicitor and prepare them for the Parts 1 and 2 of the new Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE).

Curriculum

For candidates who have previously earned a bachelor's law degree or an LLB, this 30-month curriculum has been created to help them get ready for the Parts 1 and 2 of the Solicitors Qualifying Exams. After successfully completing the programme and passing the SRA Character & Suitability test, apprentices will be qualified solicitors and ready to practise law on day one.
